- 1. **Read 1 Peter 2:11-12, 3:15** (printed above). What strikes you in these verses? What questions arise as you read them? Feel free to wrestle with those questions out loud together.
- 2. What's your gut response to the idea of witnessing? What in your background contributes to that response?
- 3. Reflect on Jesus' interactions with Nicodemus and the woman at the well in John 3 and 4. What do you notice about the way Jesus talks with people about spiritual truth? What does He do? What doesn't He do?
- 4. Why do you think Peter seizes on hope as the thing that sets Jesus' followers apart from the rest of the population?
- 5. How would you, clearly and succinctly, explain to someone who Jesus is and why His life is significant? What would you include?
- 6. How would you express to someone the difference Jesus makes in your life and why you trust Him and place your hope in Him?
